Lock in the new weding date with all of your hired pros with a fresh contract.

COVID-19 TIMELINE

4-6 MONTHS

-Update your wedding website with the new date and notify your guests.

- Contact the hotel about moving the date for your block of rooms

- Order wedding cake

- Finalize your updated guest list

3 MONTHS

-Hair and make up trial (if you are able to)

-Check on your homeymoon travel updates and if there is a ban in place -Update seating chart with new guest list

2 MONTHS

-Go over ceremony details

-Finalize fittings for wedding party and parents

-Create wedding day timelines

1 month

- -Final fitting
- -Pick up marriage license (if applicable)
- -Follow up with guests who have not RSVP'd
- -Start breaking in your wedding shoes

1 week

- -Gather up all of your accessories
- -Finalize decoration details
- -Ask for HELP when you need it

WEDDING DAY

- -Eat breakfast
- -Drink water
- -Layout your details you want in pictures
- -Exchange notes with your fiancé-Relax, smile, soak it all up-It's FINALLY HERE!
